# History

Nearly two decades ago, Father Joseph Champlin realized that too many children in need were not graduating from high school. He desperately wanted to find a way to stop the cycle of poverty for these kids by helping them to receive a quality education based on a strong set of values. In 1997, he started the Guardian Angel Society to raise funds for tuition assistance to allow children to attend Cathedral School and to provide mentor relationships for the young children so they would enjoy academic success.

He wanted these children to experience school in more than just classrooms. He wanted them to know school as an oasis and an island of calm where they feel loved and accepted. Father Champlin knew that only when children feel safe, appreciated, and are given the tools, can they begin to learn.

In 2006, the Cathedral School closed and in September 2006, Cathedral School and Our Lady of Pompei School merged to form Cathedral Academy at Pompei (CAP) at the Our Lady of Pompei School building. What exists today is just what Father Champlin envisioned, hoped and prayed for until his passing in January of 2008. CAP is a sanctuary for so many children. From there, many students choose to continue on to Bishop Grimes, Bishop Ludden or Christian Brothers Academy. Father ensured scholarships would be available to those families in need through to the kids' high school graduation.

After Father Champlin's death, a retreat was held in November, 2009 to discuss the reorganization of the Society. This group included long-time Development Director, Kathy Fedrizzi and the trusted Advisory Committee that Father Champlin personally organized before his passing. From this pivotal meeting, a volunteer, working board of directors was established in May 2010 and the organization continues today to operate with a small 1.5 full-time-equivalent paid staff and many volunteers.

He received tuition assistance but he also received something more: mentoring support and someone believing in his dreams to become a financial whiz. Immediately upon graduation from Notre Dame, Lawrence was employed by Goldman Sachs and now runs his own business.

Father Champlin's Guardian Angel Society has helped hundreds of kids like Lawrence who said, "I cannot help but reflect on how it took just one organization believing in a child's desire to be better, to change my life."

Guardian Angel Society kids represent a very diverse population but all hail from the Syracuse metropolitan area. Despite the extreme challenges their families face, they strongly desire the children to receive a quality education and build strong values.

Studies show that with intervention these "at risk" students stay in school, are much more likely to acquire necessary work-related skills and have opportunities for a college education.
